MASONIC HALL CENTENARY

Over the last few months we have been looking back 100 years into the Lodge minutes to try to gauge the undertaking that our Brethren took to build our Masonic Hall in 1924.

After a short recess of one month the Lodge started back in September 1923 . The minutes

confirm that the Lodge has redeemed from the Bank of England £450 in War Loans. In September the Brethren also agreed that tickets for the Grand Lodge Installation and Festival of St. Andrew on 30th. November (a Friday !) for the RWM, WSW and WJW at a cost of 8/6d each. (approx. £78 in todays value) The Regular Meetings in October reveal some interesting points, the Fund Raising events for the Hall Fund results were reported to the Members, the Concert lost £17, but the raffle for the gold pocket watch was £90 to the good. The Brethren agreed that further Fund Raising efforts were required and agreed that a Dance be held in January and a Bazaar was to be organised to raise the £1,000 that it was thought was needed to complete the building debt free. Note, £1,000 in 1923 is equivalent to about £78,000 today !! Perhaps the most interesting minute regards the laying of a corner stone. The point was raised at the second meeting in October to carry out a ceremonial laying of a foundation stone for the New Hall. After some discussion, points were put for and against the proposal, eventually, it was decided not to have a ceremonial to lay a foundation stone.

Work Party.

A measure of how the extensive work carried out on our Hall over the past few years can be gauged by the minimal work party this summer. All the gutters were cleaned and debris cleared from the downpipe entries. This needs to be an annual task as leaves and moss blocking

the outlets can cause water to build up and overflow into the building. Weedkilling was again carried out and we are eventually getting on top of the persistent horse tail weed. The benefits of the low maintenance areas can be seen with minimal weed growth. Ceiling damage caused by the burst water pipe in the loft in January was repaired and the gents toilet ceiling and the corridor ceiling was painted. The bar was completely emptied and cleaned by Jim McLennan and lan Dick and was varnished by Norrie Telfer.

This work puts us in a good position for the Hall Centenary next year. Thanks to everyone who assisted with the work.
